CORONA—The retired pastor of St. Edward parish, Msgr. Matthew Thompson, died in a hospital here Sunday, Oct. 3. He was 71.

Msgr. Thompson came to St. Edward's as pastor in 1943 and retired after 32 years, in 1975, to live next to the church he had served for a record period.


Msgr. 'Mat', Thompson was responsible for all the present buildings which comprise the parish property in the 400-500 blocks of Fifth Street, Corona.

ORDAINED in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester, N.Y., in 1928, for the Diocese of Los Angeles which then included San Diego, Msgr. Thompson was born in Longford, Ireland, in 1905. He attended seminary at St. Patrick's, Menlo Park and St. Bernard's, Rochester.

In a priestly apostolate covering almost 50 years, Msgr. Thompson served in parishes ranging from Los Angeles to Calexico, from Big Bear Lake to Corona. He was also, for a time, chaplain at Nazareth Home and part-time editor of the Southern Cross.

ROSARY services in St. Edward church in Spanish and English were held Tuesday evening and a Mass in Spanish was to be celebrated by Bishop Gilbert Chavez Wednesday.

Also on Wednesday was the funeral Mass with Bishop Leo T, Maher as principal concelebrant and homily by Bishop William Johnson of Orange diocese, (Report next week).

Recovered a little from the shock you administerd to me yesterday I must now tell you my reactions.

Firstly, I reject in toto as fabrications the alleged reasins adduced for my contemplated removal as pastor of St. Edwards.

You said that the parish is rundown. If that is so how is it that the last penny owed on it was paid off just a few weeks ago? Have you ever been kept waiting for payment on any bills or assessments? Have you ever been around almost any night in the week to see the activities of the parish? Have you ever heard of any neglect of the sick or the living in the parish? Have you not heard of the attention given to the Mexican-American part of the parish? We have 1200 CCD students and almost 400 in the school. We have Adult instruction, Bible classes, ultreyas and individual instructions. We also have a few clabs for the young Mexican-Americans. Does that sound like a rundown parish?

The statements that I overindulge in liquor, despite what you say you saw yourself or what my friends say is simply not true.

This being the era of post Vatican II I challenge the Personnel Board to produce the evidence on which they based their unanimous judgment. I'm entitled to that.

My health, thank God, is reasonably good despite the wishful thinking of former associates.

If you wish to form a JUST judgment of the parish and of myself come and see for yourself and do not rely on clerical gossip. The facts speak for themselves and it is on facts I would like you to base your conscientious judgment.

- 1. Chaplain, Captain, James N. Thompson is the only Catholic Chaplain at Sewart Air Force Base, Tennessee. He runs the Catholic Program while also participating in non-denominational activities. Since coming to this base his main objective has been to develop a vibrant Catholic community with full involvement of all his people. While each of the organizations he has established has its own proper goals, they all work together as members of a family for the good of all. The involvement, interest and cooperation of the single airmen in these programs are outstanding. Chaplain Thompson feels that single airmen should not be viewed as a group apart but rather as members of this family, enriching themselves and all the members through their interest and work. Specific details and significant results which exemplify his performance are:
- a. The principal reason for his success with the single airmen is his daily duty station visits. He gets away from the office each day to visit the men at work, in the dining halls, during their leisure hours and in recreational areas. For him there is just no substitute for the friendships established during these visits. The men know he is interested in them as individuals and feel more free to come to him for guidance and counseling. The Catholic Chapel has become a friendly place to stop for lively conversation over a cup of coffee. He personally interviews each Catholic airman arriving on base. With such rapport established among the personnel, he has become the friend of each and every one.
- b. As a result of his close contact with the single airmen, the Sunday School program has always had sufficient teachers and substitute teachers. As a matter of fact, there is a waiting list. The many single airmen add the touch of youth and sparkle in the class-rooms. Airmen not engaged as teachers or substitutes help as hall quards, teacher assistants and supply handlers. They sponsor programs for the students in cultural and entertainment areas and conduct religious instruction by use of audio-visual aids.
- c. Sewart Air Force Base has never had a Catholic Youth Organization (CYO) until the single airmen, working with parents as advisors, spensored a very successful program for the youth. Under Chaplain Thompson's direction, membership has reached 57. Meetings are held twice a month and include religious instruction, guest speakers, outings, fellowship and entertainment.

- d. On the first Saturday of each month a folk mass is held, especially for young people. Single airmen have taken a prominent part in developing the music for the mass. Through their work in this field, they are able to form shows for the Sunday School and conduct classes and sing-ins through this medium. This provides for the future in developing ever more meaningful and timely forms of religious and cultural communication.
- e. In the home mass program established by Chaplain Thompson, the families invite single airmen to their homes. Friendships are developed and excessive loneliness alleviated. After the masses the period for discussion gives opportunity for exchange of ideas, growth in knowledge of Christian living and good community fellowship.
- f. Sewart AFB's first outdoor living Rosary ceremony on 25 May 1969 was planned by single airmen. They solicited and received advice and participation from the Knights of Columbus and local organizations. The spirit of unity and love was evident in the parts each organization played and the reception afterwards in the Chapel Center.
- g. The Family Life Conference held 23 25 May 1969, had two sessions for single airmen. The large attendance attests to the interest shown by Chaplain Thompson who was project officer for this event. The discussions were lively and comments from the participants showed that they derived much benefit for enrichment of their lives.
- h. With the aid of Chaplain Thompson the base participated in the Single Airman Workshop for Catholic personnel. Through his devoted effort the full quota of personnel was met and the conference was held at St Leo, Florida, 28 April through 1 May 1969. These men returned with new ideas and enthusiasm and have shared their experiences with the community. They are now actively engaged in putting their new ideas to work for the benefit of all.
- i. This year also saw the beginning of the Parish Council in accordance with the Spirit of Renewal in the church. Elected representatives of each organization in the chapel program met to coordinate their efforts and share their ideas with the chaplain. Chaplain Thompson has provided for the single airmen by having them speak for their interests.
- j. Chaplain Thompson started the Catholic Men Society. While working within this structure, the single airmen decided to do something special for their particular group and the idea of the "Lid" was born. "The Lid", a form of coffee-house fellowship and entertainment for all airmen, has proven very popular and promises a great future in presenting something new and unique.

- k. When the choir was without a director, Chaplain Thompson obtained help from the single airmen. The new choir director is a single airmen whose major in college was music prior to enlistment in the Air Force. Under his direction the choir has increased in size by 100 percent and enhanced the beauty of the mass. The choir has been so enthusiastic that they will participate in the USAF Choir Contest.
- 1. With Chaplain Thompson's guidance, the single airmen have taken more leading parts in the worship of the community as choir members, lectors, commentators, ushers and altar boy director.
- 2. Chaplain Thompson has worked closely with the Installation Chaplain, keeping him informed at all times concerning his work. He is most congenial and brotherly with all chaplain personnel and is loved and respected by all who know him, regardless of religious faith. His performance here makes it easy to understand why he has received the Bronze Star and the Air Force Commendation Medal, with Oak Leaf Cluster, for service prior to his arrival at Sewart Air Force Base.
- 3. The idea of having the single airmen work in all phases of the chaplain program has proven an outstanding success. They believe they really belong and show that they have much to contribute. The Air Force likes to be known as a happy family with all the blessings that come from living and contributing in this way of life. Single airmen at Sewart AFB know the Air Force is indeed a happy family with much to offer. They know and experience this through the efforts of Chaplain Thompson who has devoted so much time and devotion beyond the call of duty to their welfare. Through his work the United States Air Force has benefitted very much indeed and I hasten to recommend him for the Terence P. Finneyan Award.

It is difficult for me to maintain composure in replying to your telephone conversation of yesterday. You had the advantage of me as you were angry when you called and I did not have a chance to get angry until after you hung up unceremoniously.

Your imperious attitude and dictatorial language went out with Urban VI who, I believe, was the last Pope to hang six of his Cardinals.

The notes from which I read covered the life of the priest and that included pastor-assistant relationship, attitudes, duties and courtesies of pastors and asistants and also relationship with the Bishop.

The part which you have interpreted personally is: "They(the priests) should have the right to see the bishop directly without having to tell the nature of their business to those who assist the bishop. All activities concerning personal matters in the Chancery should be kept secret".

All points, including this one, were of a general nature and I do not see why you should take it personally for it was not so intended. I regret very much the Monsignor Booth, whom I admire and respect, should be led to think that I insulted him or you. I also regret that you have placed on me the onus of writing a letter such as this.

Dear Monsignor Thompson:

Thank you for your letter of March 4, 1967. I have shown this to His Excellency.

You are correct when you state that I did have the advantage of you by being angry when I called you a few days ago. I can honestly say that I have never been so angry nor have I, either before my ordination to the priesthood nor since, spoken so abruptly to a priest. However, I feel that I was justified.

You have not as yet substantiated your right to include in your list of complaints or problems the statement directed to the so-called problem that exists between priests and the Chancery. You seem to think that I have taken this as a personal affront and that I am the only one who has done so. Let me set the record straight. The Bishop also felt this same way, and it was as a result of your statements, that he challenged me concerning the procedure that a priest goes through to see him.

I cannot agree that your remarks are of a general nature in this specific instance. Certainly your statement of Pastor-Assistant relationships can be accepted as general since there are several hundred of these. However, the Priest and Chancery relations of which you speak narrow down to two priests, who in any way whatsoever, have anything to do with a priest much more personal can you get? And you have not come forth with a single remarks.

I am certainly in favor of improved attitudes and courtesies between priests and also as much democracy as is possible amongst priests; however, I do not intend to be made the scapegoat simply because I occupy such a very special post. I have always attempted to help the priests of the Diocese in every way possible, your own self included, specifically in your difficulties with past assistants. As far as I am concerned, this ends the issue. I am satisfied that I am doing my best to serve the priests and the Bishop and will continue in this until my superiors see fit to change.

In pursuance of our conversation of the other evening I feel that there are a few other things of which I should inform you so that everything may be in the clear.

When the Provincial of the Trinitarians was out here he asked me to write to him from time to time so that he might keep in touch with the progress of Fr. Philip. He informed me that he would then write and advise Fr. Philip and so aid in directing his developement. I wrote to Fr. Nusca twice and noticed some change for the better in the young man afterwards. The last time I wrote I informed him that I asked Fr. Philip to learn Spanish when he came here as he would be of little use in a parish where there are more than 3,000 people who know no other tongue, if he did no know Spanish. At the end of a year it now comes back to me, to quote himself "to learn Spanish would be a waste of time for I will not be here long anyway". I told the Provingial that it would be necessary for me to request a change of curates for the good of souls unless the young man changed his attitude. I did not want to trouble your Excellency with any monor difficulties and I had hoped that with patience and a little pastoral charity there might be a change for the better. However, Fr. Philip is in an unsettled frame of mind and seems determined to leave the order. After observing him for a year I am of the opinion that it would be highly dangerous for him to leave the order. What he needs most now is to return to the order and to learn the practice of obedience. Believe me I say this not with the intention of stating a charge but with a view to his eternal salvation. "I.... firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who-far worse stilladmit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

Please write me your reaction and let me know how many Mexican souls belong to your parish in Calexico and if it has been your custom to read the Epistle and Gospel and give and instruction to them in Spanish.

Referring to the letter from the Central Office of July 11th which quoted a telegram addressed to the Secretary by Rev. Matthew Thompson, Calexico, California, on the 6th Inst., regarding the prospective exclusion of four religious sisters at that port, to which your reply of course has not yet been received, it is deemed fitting now particularly because of the receipt of a much longer telegram of the clergyman of July 12th, to state that it is the policy of this Department in these sort of cases to regard the expenditure of money for the purpose of securing immigration visas and paying return transportation to the United States as a part of the rumuneration for teaching or other duties which these sisters perform, rather than a gratuity as contemplated within the meaning of Section 3 of the 1917 Act. It is therefore ordinarily held that they are not properly excludable as persons whose passage has been paid by for by a society, corporation, association, etc., one of the excludable grounds under Sec. 3 of the Act mentioned.

In the cases of Manuela Reyes Hernandez and Maria Del Carmen Josefina Ruiz Velasco, your No. 11039/181 and Calexico No. 10539/44, whose appeals were sustained, you were informed substantially as above on footnote to the confirmation of telegram sent Calexico on July 12th.

Dear Father Thompson:

First let me thank you sincerely for your valuable assistance to the Southern Cross by sending us the very fine editorials.

Sometime ago you presented a question regarding the absolution of penitents apparently under a censure from Mexico. After giving the matter considerable study and sonsulting two outstanding authorities, herewith is submitted the following opinion.

- 1. Theoretically it would seem that one must deny absolution to such penitents since they are going right back to the occasion of sin forbidden under excommunication.
- 2. There is a question in my mind as to whether or not these said people are under censure. Subjectively they are in good faith and not conscious of any sin and also not clear and explicit about incurring censure. It is very doubtful if they have, in reality, incurred sensure.
- 3. Presuming, however, that they are under censure their proper Ordinary is after all the best judge of conditions in his Diocese and the presumption is in his See. Surely he knows all the difficulties of the penitents.
- 4. Practically I would advise such penitents to write to their Ordinaries and explain their difficulties and ask for permission to retain their positions giving the reasons that you gave to me on the occasion of your visit.

In dealing with each individual case, however, let us not forget that is is a very serious thing to refuse absolution and very rarely should it be donel
