## THE VIEW FROM MY WINDOW NORTH

As many of you know, I returned from my missionary experience in Alaska on August 16<sup>th</sup>. It has been a particular quest of mine to go to Fairbanks and help out in that Diocese since my first encounter in flying a single engine plane there in 1986. At that time the current Bishop was also an active pilot and invited me back whenever I could, to fly into different villages and help with their sacramental life. They had few priests, mostly Jesuits, and even fewer who piloted ariplanes.

I remember in 1989, I promised to fly up in a Cessna C205 that I owned with 3 other pilots. The Bishop wanted me there on a specific day to say mass at St. Mary's, way out on the Yukon near where it flowed into the Bering Sea. "Specific Days" are a terrible itinery to keep when flying in the weather of Alaska, not to mention that I was flying from Fullerton. I encountered weather in Washington and was delayed. But I finally made it to Fairbanks 2 days late. The Bishop was a little miffed because he flies "in that weather" all the time. Well, I didn't and didn't want to be a statistic.

Well, he wanted me to get right away down to St. Mary's. "But Bishop, the clouds are down to 400 feet along the Yukon", I said. He said "I fly that route at 200 feet all the time, just follow the river, but watch for those yellow balls they use in those wires across the river". Well, I did it, and I must admit it was a learning experience for me. I learned what I am comfortable with, and what my limits were, and what I will never be forced into doing again.

In my next 6 times flying a small plane to Alaska, I kept building experience, familiarity with terrain, with weather and with a love for the beauty of God's creation from above and with the people below. Added to this, my own family's presence in Alaska (one greatgrandparent was a shipwright-carpenter-on a Whaler in the Aluetians, and the other had gone

## MEMORIAL OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY - OCTOBER 7

In 1571 Pope Pius V instituted "Our Lady of Victory" as an annual feast to commemorate a victorious naval battle near Lepanto, Greece. In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the title of this feast day to "Feast of the Holy Rosary." In 1969, Pope Paul VI changed the name of the feast to "Our Lady of the Rosary." Prayer to Our Lady now focuses more on peace than on military victory.

The development of the rosary has a long history. First, a practice developed of praying 150 Our Fathers in imitation of the 150 Psalms. Then there was a parallel practice of

praying 150 Hail Marys. Soon a mystery of Jesus' life was attached to each Hail Mary. Though Mary's giving the rosary to St. Dominic is recognized as a legend, the development of this prayer form owes much to the followers of St. Dominic. One of them, Alan de la Roche, was known as "the apostle of the rosary." He founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15th century. In the 16th century the rosary was developed to its present form-with the 15 mysteries (joyful, sorrowful and glorious). In 2002, Pope John Paul II added the Mysteries of Light to this devotion.

to stake a claim in Nome in 1898. He eventually owned a bar there; more profitable I guess).

Since that first trip in 1986, I have been all over Alaska from the farthest north in Barrow to the farthest south in Ketchikan, the west in Nome and the east in Eagle. I can only say what an incredible experience it has all been being a priest, celebrating the sacraments for all the Native peoples and Anglos, getting to know them and their stories, and being a pilot to see it all from the air: the mountains, the glaciers, rivers, valleys and the miriade of colors in everything.

So, as I talked about this in the past, J. Bruce Camino approached me this year and offered to use his plane to fly me up. He has been the Chief Pilot for the "Flying Doctors" who go to remote places in Mexico. I must admit I "checked him out" one day when he asked me to go flying with him. That doesn't sound very nice and trusting, but it is a long trip, over some very serious terrain and weather, and I wanted to be comfortable in his plane as well, as we would have to trust that engine, airframe and electronics in very compromising situations.

Well, needless to say it would be a good match in all dimensions. He had all the logs for me, everything was up to date, and the electronics, or as we say, avionics, rivaled what they have in commercial airplanes with 3 GPS's, autopilot, and current weather reporting on GPS and IPADS in the plane. I am used to following a map and using instruments to fixing our progress on the chart. His avionics did that and more. Wow!

So we met many times to discuss our route options based on weather, personal gear, survival gear (required when flying over Canada and Alaska) and finally weight and balance issues. Small airplanes are more sensitive about weight distribution than the Jets, but they still weigh your bags for that reason. Then J. Bruce finally asked me

if a third person could come. This worked out great as it was Mike Gilmore another Curcillista. So, J. Bruce would be the Pilot, I would be Co-Pilot, co-navigator, contact person, tour director and Mike would be Steward, map passer, food dispenser, picture-taker and most importantly, Prayer Director in the airplane. Although, there were times of long distances during which we together said a rosary, there were many occasions of his private prayers while we were in clouds diligently following our instruments, dropping below clouds flying over ridges of mountains and dropping in to wet short runways. I knew he had an Ipad and kept looking at it many times during flight. What I found out on the way home is that he had the scriptural mysteries of the rosary on it. Now that is some necessary equipment every airplane needs. So D-Day, we meet at the airport with all of our stuff. It is time for final weigh-in and, well...next time.

## IN & AROUND OUR COMMUNITY

#### Important Youth Safety Information

In keeping with our Diocesesan and Parish Policy against Sexual Misconduct with Minors and our pledge to be vigilant in the best interests of the children and youth of our parishes, we alert you to a current serious matter.

In late June of 2009 a complaint was filed in superior court against the Roman Catholic Diocese of Orange pertaining to alleged incidents of sexual misconduct that reportedly took place while the plaintiff was a student at St. Justin Martyr School from 1978 - 1986. The complaint alleges that in 2006 the plaintiff recovered dormant memories of abuse, repressed since childhood. This complaint named three former priests and one former lay employee at the time of its filing.

Earlier this year the plaintiff also recovered memory of abuse by another priest while at St. Justin Martyr. The plaintiff, through his attorney, reported an allegation against Rev. Timothy Ramaekers pertaining to when he was a parochial vicar at St. Justin Martyr Church in 1986. Rev. Ramaekers is currently the pastor of St. Joseph Church in Placentia, where he has served since 1997.

In keeping with established policy, upon receiving the allegations against Fr.. Ramaekers, the Diocese of Orange Sexual Misconduct Oversight and Review Board launched an investigation conducted by an independent investigator. To date, this investigation has resulted in finding NO credible evidence to support this allegation against Rev. Ramaekers. Fr. Ramaekers, who was ordained in 1982, and has not been the subject of any past complaints of such misconduct.

We are requested to announce this because of current reporting mandates. Should anyone have any information regarding alleged misconduct on the part of Rev. Timothy Ramaekers, you are requested to report such information directly to the Anaheim Police Department at (714) 765-1521. We also want to remind you of the Diocesan Assistance Ministry Program and the toll free reporting line 1-800-374-3046.
