

On 2-2-75, Undersigned at approximately 0900 hours contacted Witness #2, the park ranger at Mt. Palomar State Park. Witness proceeded to check his park camp records and ascertained that Suspect Turley had checked into Doan Camp Grounds on 1-24-75 and stayed until 1-26-75. Suspect stayed in camp site #45. Suspect was driving a late model Chevy Nova with a white vinyl top and red body. The vehicle was a 2-door with a British Columbia license plate. The Suspect was also in the company of two young boys and a young girl. The girl was approximately 11 years old and her first name was

Ranger further related that Suspect was parked next to camp site #44, which was being used by Victim's scout troop. Ranger remembers the Suspect quite well, describing him as a male caucasion approximately 21 years, 6/1-6/2, 160-165 lbs., with tight curly sandy or reddish hair.

Ranger ponfirmed the information already obtained by Deputy Lackey as to Suspect's identity and the vehicle description license number and the information that it was a British Columbia stolen.

Undersigned next contacted Witness who is assistant scout master of Victim's troop and who gave Undersigned several boy scout's names who had been to the Doan Camp Grounds and possibly knew Suspect's name and further information.

Mr. urther described Suspect stating that Suspect, apparently, was involved in scouting or had been involved in scouting because during their conversation, he had

great knowledge as to scouting. He stated that Suspect did have two young boys and a girl with him, the girl being approximately 11 and very cute. Suspect had told him that he was staying in California with some friends, possibly in the Tustin or Garden Grove area.

Undersigned next proceeded to contact several members of the boy scout troop and the general concensus of the boys contacted confirmed that the girl with Suspect was named and lived in the Suspect.

Undersigned, subsequently, contacted scout

dvised me that the Suspect had stated he was
living a notel in The girl with Suspect was named and was
11 years old and the children with Suspect were possibly cousins of Suspect. He
also stated that Suspect's vehicle was a white over red hatchback, possibly a Chevy
Vega with British Columbia plates. He stated that his brother possibly could add
further information, but was not at home at this time.

Undersigned again contacted Witness who gave additional information that Suspect claimed to be an airline pilot and possibly had rented a plane while in Southern California. Suspect had air maps of Southern California and a portable "Sony" radio, which picked up commercial air flights.

He also stated he believed was 11 years old and that the younger of the two boys, which was about 12 years old, was brother. He also believed the other boy to be approximately 14-15 years old and could possibly be from Canada.

At 1130 hours, Undersigned was contacted by Witness who stated approximately the same as his brother, but related that one of the boys with Suspect was named I asked him how he knew his name was and he said that the boy had the initials on the ax and he asked what the initials stood for, to which the boy replied

He also stated this lived in and that sister, was not related to Suspect. He believed that Suspect's vehicle was a red Pontiac Ventura.

Undersigned next proceeded to Victim's mother's residence and contacted Victim's mother at 1200-hours. Victim's mother advised Undersigned that Suspect had told her he was taking Victim to Disneyland and would return at 1600 hours. She did observe her son leave the location with a wine colored bathing suit under his jacket.

Undersigned then proceeded to the Garden Grove Police Department and enroute was advised by radio that the British Columbia Police had checked Suspect's apartment and had ascertained letters at the apartment from

Undersigned upon arriving at Garden Grove Police Department was accompanied to the residence by Detective Ed Spangler of the Garden Grove Police Department, where we contacted R and his sister,

Both acknowledged that they had been to Camp Doan with Suspect, along with their friend, R Witness States that Suspect has been living at their residence since 2005 hours, 1-17-75. He relates that he knows Suspect, as he met him at the World's Fair in Spokane, Washington,

several months prior and had been corresponding with him since that time. He further related that all of Suspect's belongings were still at their residence and that Suspect had chartered an airplane on 1-28-75 from Skyhaven Aviation, (unknown city), and produced a receipt made out to R.J. Turley for a C-150, Serial

He further relates that Suspect left their residence on 1-31-75 at 1330 hours and has not returned. Suspect had promised him that they would go flying on 1-1-75 but had not returned. His mother had loaned Suspect two (2) revolvers, both .22 caliber, one with a black handle and one with a pearl handle, NFD. Suspect also had taken 200 rounds of 22 caliber ammunition long rifle cartridges, "Federal" brand. He and Suspect were going to Barston 1-1-75 and stay at an airtel and shoot the weapons at a pistol range. Witness Karlson also relates that he was missing approximately \$119.00 from his residence and had reported the theft to the Garden Grove Police Department and he believed that Suspect possibly took the money.

At approximately 1515 hours, Undersigned was advised by Industry Station by landline that Suspect had left his stolen British Columbia vehicle at the Fallbrook Airport in San Diego County, and had stolen a 1770 cessna model 172, license

Undersigned contacted Witness Deputy Ted Snoddy, who was at the Fallbrook Airport and advised Undersigned that Suspect was presently enroute to Apple Valley Airport with the stolen Cessna (San Diego Co. Sheriff's file Undersigned was subsequently advised that Suspect had failed to land at Apple Valley Airport and apparently was having difficulty and was proceeding to Daggett/Earstow Airport. Undersigned was further advised a short time later that Suspect had been apprehended by the San Bernardino Sheriff's Department and had been transported to the San Bernardino County Jail and that Victim was located unharmed in the aircraft and also would be transported to the San Bernardino County Courthouse. Undersigned then proceeded to the San Bernardino County Courthouse and at 1920 hours, Undersigned Interviewed Victim.

Victim related the following: He had met Suspect on the camping trip to Doan Camp Grounds a couple of weeks prior. Suspect had attended a troup meeting on the prior Wednesday and on Saturday, 171-75, had come to his house and invited him to show him around the town and go to the Los Angeles Zoo. He had arrived at Victim's residence at approximately 1500 hours or 1600 hours on 1-1-75, and got the permission from his mother to take him to the Zoo. He and Suspect then went to the miniature golf course on Valley Boulevard east of Hacienda Boulevard and played miniature golf. Suspect stated he wanted to see Sea World and Suspect started driving in the British Columbia stolen vehicle.

Prior to reaching Sea World, they stopped at Fallbrook Airport, where Suspect rented an airplane and he (Suspect) and an instructor flew for an hour and the Suspect paid the instructor \$29.00 for the flight. After leaving the airport, they stopped at a gas station and Suspect went to a telephone booth and called his (Victim's) mother. He could see Suspect on the telephone and the Suspect's lips moving, but he could not hear what Suspect was saying. Suspect returned to the car and told him that his mother had stated it was up to him (Victim) if he wanted to stay overnight with Suspect and he advised Suspect it was 0-K with him because it was a long way home.

They then drove to Sea World, but it was closed: "From Sea World, they then travelled to a camp ground near Mt. Palomar, where he and Suspect slept in the vehicle under an open sleeping bag. He relates that Suspect never hurt him or threatened him, but did at one time put his hand on Victim's back during the night and asked him if he was cold.

On the morning of 2-2-75, they drove back to the Fallbrook Airport, as Suspect had made

another flying appointment the day prior, but they were too early for their appointment. The Suspect checked out a plane on the flight line that had the keys in it and Suspect told him to come on. They were going to fly solo. Suspect put his brown leather travelling bag in the plane, got in the plane, and he got in the plane with Suspect.

They then took off in the stolen plane (San Diego County Sheriff's Department file While flying, Suspect advised him that he had stolen the plane, but he (Victim) kept saying that Suspect was kidding and he didn't believe him. Suspect kept telling him he stole the plane and Suspect then flew down over a freeway very low to scare the drivers of the cars. He stated that the freeway was near the Mexico border and that it was illegal to fly low. Suspect let him hold the controls of the airplane for a period of time while in flight and he tried to turn the beacon light on to attract attention, but he never accomplished this.

Suspect asked him if he wanted to go to Canada and he did not reply. They then flew over a bombing area and Suspect stated that the plane was low on fuel. Suspect then used the radio and someone replied on the radio something about a stolen plane going down for fuel. The Suspect heard this and said that he was going to land the plane where no one was at. Suspect attempted to land in the desert, but changed his mind because the landing area was too short. They then flew to the airport (Daggett/Barstow Airport), where Suspect was arrested.

Victim stated that he was a little afraid when he found out the plane was stolen and that the fuel was almost exhausted on the plane. Victim stated that he never observed any guns in the plane. At this time, the interview was terminated.

Undersigned and Victim then proceeded to the San Bernardino County Main Jail and there placed Suspect under arrest for Child Stealing and he was then transported to Industry Sheriff's Station, where he was booked on the above charge of Child Stealing.

On 2-2-75 at 2150 hours, Undersigned and Lieutenant Schartau in interview room #1, advised Suspect of his Constitutional Rights per SHAD 477. Suspect stated, "yes", "yes" and "no, not really" to questions #5, #6, and #7.

Suspect related that he has been involved in scouting most of his life and obtained the position of the District Counsellor in British Columbia and that he recently came to Southern California. He stated he is presently staying with and has been staying with them for the last 11 days.

He made friends with the people from Victim's troop and they invited him to come to one of their scout meetings. Wednesday, he went to the scout meeting and talked with the scouts and showed them a blanket with numerous scout badges. He told some of the boys that he wanted them to show him parts of the different sights of Southern California and on 2-1-75, he had gone to the Valinda area and met some of the boys from the scout troop, gone to K-Mart with one of the troop's boys by the name of ather. He then left K-Mart and went over and picked Victim up from his residence telling his mother that he would return him about 6 p.m., and that they were going to see some sights.

Suspect also related that at one point, when he took the plane, that he wanted to just make one more solo flight and drop the boy off, and then maybe just crash the plane and kill himself.

Interview was terminated at 2400 hours.

On 2-3-75 at 0830 hours, Undersigned contacted the Police Department and was advised that the stolen money from Witness had been reported as a 488 PC (Petty Theft) under file

Undersigned at 0900 hours, 2-3-75, contacted the San Diego Sheriff's Department, who advised Undersigned that the British Columbia stolen vehicle, a 1974 Ventura, white vinyl over red, British Columbia license was impounded at Mesa Towing, Fallbrook, California, Phone I was also advised that the Vista sub-station and Detective Martin Hale was handling the stolen plane case, file

At 0930 hours, 2-3-75, Undersigned contacted Staff Sergeant Angus Stewart of the Victoria City Police, British Columbia, Phone: Undersigned advised Sergeant Stewart of the whereabouts of their stolen vehicle. Sergeant Stewart advised me he would advise the registered owner and Victim of the stolen vehicle's whereabouts.

At 1100 hours, 2-3-75, Undersigned contacted National Park Ranger at Lake Henshaw, San Diego County, Phone and advised him that Suspect had stated that he had camped in one of the camp grounds in that area on 2-1-75 and had put \$2.00 in an envelope in that camp site where he had stayed overnight with Victim. Ranger stated he would check the camp sites and would advise Undersigned if he could logate any information linking Suspect with the camp grounds.

On 2-3-75 at 1020 hours, Undersigned again interviewed

I confronted him with prior statements made by the Suspect. Victim, at this time, stated that Suspect had two guns in the airplane and prior to landing the aircraft and being arrested, Suspect had told him to throw the weapons out the window of the airplane. Suspect also threw out, what looked like, a credit card after he had crinkled it up. He also admitted that he had fired one of the revolvers twice at a site sign with green letters near the camp grounds on 2-2-75 and Suspect had fired six shots. He admitted that he took the swim trunks with him when he left his location because he thought that he and Suspect might go swimming. At this time, the interview with Victim was terminated.

This case to be presented to the Citrus District Attorney for prosecution.
