



## Jewish Brotherhood Greet Nuns, Priests

A priest set the tone for a precedent-making evening sponsored by the Brotherhood of Temple Israel at its meeting House on the Riverway recently.

Rev. Laurence A. Dorr, S.J., of Boston College, called the occasion "a symbol of the life we should live together, with love and understanding, so that brotherhood can begin."

A nun, Sister Norbert, S.P., of St. Mary-of-the-Woods College, Terre Haute, Ind., was the speaker. Sister Norbert, a young woman in the order only six years, spoke on the interfaith program at her college which preceded Vatican II.

Her audience included a number of Catholic College educators—nuns and priests—who came to break bread
