

## Glen Rock Seminarian to Be Ordained in Camden Saturday

Rev. Daniel F. M. Millard, son of Mrs. Mary Orr Millard, of 443 Ackerman Ave., Glen Rock, and the late James C. B. Millard, will be ordained to the priesthood Saturday morning by the Most Rev. Bartholomew J. Eustace in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Camden.

### FIRST MASS SUNDAY

Father Millard, who will be assigned to the Diocese of Camden, will celebrate his first solemn Mass in his parish church, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, Ridgewood, at noon Sunday.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. James F. Kelley, pastor, will be archpriest. Rev. Neil McDonald, professor of Moral Theology at Christ the King Seminary, will be the deacon, and Rev. Leonard Donohue will be the subdeacon.

The sermon will be preached by Rev. Raymond York, S. J., professor at St. Peter's High School, Jersey City. Mr. William Schmidt, a seminarian, of Ridgewood, will be master of ceremonies. Mr. C. Arthur Jamison will sing and Mr. Richard Jamison will be a minor minister.

A reception for Father Millard will be held on Sunday afternoon from 4 to 7 in the Ridgewood school auditorium. The public has been invited to attend. Benediction will be held in the evening at 7:30 in the church.

Father Millard was born on Feb. 18, 1923, in Ridgewood, where the family resided until last September, when they moved from their Prospect St. home to reside in Glen Rock.

A graduate of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel School, Ridgewood, he attended St. Francis Xavier High School, New York City.

He was graduated from St. Joseph's High School, Paterson in 1942, where he was president of the senior class and manager of the basketball team which won the city tournament in that year. In 1946, he was toastmaster at the Elks Club basketball dinner, when

Father Millard received his bachelor of science degree in business administration from Holy Cross College, Worcester, Mass., in June, 1947. In 1948, he completed a course in Ecclesiastical Arts at Seton Hall University, South Orange.

He entered Christ the King Seminary at St. Bonaventure's, New York, as a student for the Diocese of Camden, in September, 1948. Besides his seminary courses, he also did work for his Master's Degree in Moral Theology.

### In Army 3 Years

Father Millard's college education was interrupted for two years, as a medical technician at Fort Monmouth, and also as an actor in the Army show, "The Army Play by Play" which, after a Broadway run, toured the eastern United States, and gave a command performance for President Roosevelt at his home in Hyde Park, N.Y.

Father Millard has five brothers and sisters. They are: Mrs. Anthony A. Alcock of Paramus; Mrs. William L. Cahill, of Ridgewood; James C. B. Millard Jr., of New York City; Miss Patricia Ann Millard and Charles E. F. Millard, of Glen Rock.
