The Rt. Rev. Theophilus Pypers, prothonotary apostolic, priest in the diocese of Spokane in point of service, died yesterday in Sacred Heart hospital at the age of 78.

He also was the only priest in the diocese who had served in three dioceses without moving, Nisqually, Seattle and Spokane.

Msgr. Pypers was born in Belgium, and ordained July 1901, at Louvain, Belgium, for the diocese of Nisqually which later became the diocese of Seattle.
