DAYTON, Ohio, July 9, 1970 --- Brother Julius May, S.M., 71, former principal of Chaminade High School, Dayton, 1949-1946; died at the University of Dayton Gosiger Health Center after an extended illness on Wednesday, July 8, 1970, at 6:30 p.m.

Brother May, born October 6, 1898, was a native of Miamisburg, Ohio. He entered the Society of Mary in 1924 at Mount St. John, now the East Campus. He was assistant prefect at Mount St. John, Dayton, from 1926 till 1928. After taking his final vows on July 10, 1928, he taught at Chaminade High School, Dayton, and Dayton U. Prep School for one year. The Bachelor of Science degree was awarded to Brother May by the University of Dayton in 1928 and he received his master's degree in education in 1940 from Catholic University in Washington, D.C.

He served as sub-director and teacher at Hamilton Catholic High School, Hamilton, Ohio; from 1929-1931 and again at St. James High School in Chester, Pennsylvania, 1956-1957.

As a principal and director of the religious community he served at the following: St. Michael's High School, Brooklyn, New York, 1931-1939; <u>Chaminade</u> <u>High School, Dayton, Ohio, 1940-1946</u>; St. John the Baptist High School, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, 1946-1949 and again in 1955-1956; Marianist Preparatory School, Beacon, New York, 1949-1955; Covington Catholic High School, Covington, Kentucky, 1957-1960.

In 1960 Brother May went to North Catholic High School in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, as a teacher and remained there until early in 1970 when he returned to the University of Dayton.

Surviving are two brothers, Anthony and Alphonse, and one sister, Miss Clara H. May, all of Miamisburg.

Viewing will be in the Alumni Hall Chapel, UD campus, Friday, July 10. Funeral Mass will be on Saturday, July 11, at the UD Immaculate Conception Chapel and interment will be at the Queen of Heaven Cemetery at the East Campus immediately following the funeral Mass.
