

Ukrainian pastor appointed at Wilton

The **Rev. Richard L. Kirouac** has been appointed pastor of Saints Peter and Paul Ukrainian Catholic Church at Wilton, effective Wednesday. The appointment was made by the **Rev. Innocent Lotocky**, bishop of St. Nicholas Diocese in Chicago for Ukrainians.

Kirouac is a native of Massachusetts. His theological studies were completed through St. Basil's Seminary for the Eastern Rites in Methuen and St. Gregory the Theologian Melkite-Greek Catholic Seminary in Boston. He was in residence at St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral in Chicago and served six years on the faculty of Hudson Catholic High School in Hudson, Mass. He has also served as director of music and organist for St. Mark's Episcopal Church in

He succeeds the **Rev. George Pruys**, currently of St. John's Ukrainian Catholic Church in Belfield, who served the Wilton church for seven years. **Kirouac** will celebrate his first liturgy at Saints Peter and Paul at 10 a.m. Oct. 6.
