

One of seven children, Gerald Vosen was born on April 16, 1934, to Carl and Alice (Frantz) Vozen, of Merrimac, Wisconsin. After graduating in 1952 from Sauk City High School, he entered St. Lawrence Seminary, Mt. Calvary, Wisconsin, and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Madison on May 27, 1961. Fr. Vosen served as an associate pastor in six parishes and one mission, and as pastor in five parishes and one mission. However, he did not retire from his final parish as a pastor. Nine months

before retirement he was abruptly removed from active ministry by the diocese for reasons explained in week 51 - The Day the Music Died.

In 1972 with the help of family and friends, he established a youth club called "I Get the Window." Their motto was: "Through the visible, we see the Invisible." Over a span of twenty years, hundreds of young people were helped to see the Invisible.

This book is an extension of that power of seeing. In these stories we share the experience of others in discovering and seeing God in our daily lives. It is suggested that one chapter (week) be read at a time and then held in your heart and memory for a few days as you would a weekly homily.

From the invitation of "Come to me" to the challenging "Do you love me?" to the strong reminder "You have been purchased at a price,"

we become sensitive to God and aware of his powerful presence in our lives.
