# **Federal Government Repositories**

#### National Archives and Records Administration (NARA)

The National Archives holds historical U.S. government documents (federal, congressional, and presidential records) that are created or received by the President and his staff, by Congress, by employees of Federal government agencies, and by the Federal courts in the course of their official duties. Record Group 075 is titled Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) but also includes records from the Bureau of Indian Education (formerly Office Indian Education Programs) and the Bureau of Trust Funds Administration (formerly the Office of the Special Trustee for American Indians). Records created under this record group document the U.S. Federal government's interaction with American Indians and Alaska Natives and are held in multiple NARA federal record center physical locations.

Records held at Archives 1 provide a high-level overview of the Indian Affairs involvement in creating, maintaining, and supporting Native American boarding schools. For example, BIA reports, financial statements, circulars, and office files at Archives 1 can be useful for compiling a comprehensive list of boarding schools and understanding federal policy regarding boarding schools. Additional records (e.g., census records, correspondence, and student files) document the names and tribal affiliations of select boarding school students. Medical and hospital reports can provide insight into student deaths at boarding schools, although burial information for these students is limited. #### Bureau of Indian Affairs

#### Bureau of Indian Education

The BIE provides education services to approximately 42,000 Indian students. The BIE website provides a school directory of 183 Bureau-funded elementary and secondary schools of these, 53 are BIE-operated and 130 are tribally controlled. Bureau of Trust Funds Administration

The BTFA oversees the American Indian Records Repository (AIRR) which contains retired Indian Affairs records from BIA agencies, BIE and BTFA offices all over the nation. Physical records include Indian trust, Indian Education and other historic Indian Affairs records. The AIRR provides authorized researchers, federal employees who are conducting the historical trust accounting, Tribes, and contractors secure access to inactive records for research.

#### National Park Service
