I am sorry for the delay in responding to your email. I have been on vacation for a few days and now I am at home sick with the flu.

Since the arrival of Bishop DiLorenzo in the Diocese as our new Bishop, I have been working for him as his administrative assistant. I know I speak for the Bishop when I tell you how very sorry I am for all the pain you have suffered in your life. I remember when you met with Bishop Foley years ago and he investigated the matter that was brought to the Diocese's attention. Now that this issue is being made public, you are suffering the same pain all over again. We all feel terrible and want you to know that you have our support.

Edward Moran has been placed on administrative leave by Bishop DiLorenzo. This means he cannot function as a priest in any way at all. He cannot wear a roman collar or present himself as a Catholic priest. Bishop DiLorenzo has also withdrawn his endorsement for Edward Moran to serve as a military chaplain. At this time Edward is undergoing a psychological assessment to determine his suitability for continuation in priestly ministry. I will keep in contact with you to let you know the outcome of the assessment.

Even though you were not a minor when this occurred, you still have the same rights as any victim of abuse. In order to be of some support, we want you to know that you can contact one of our Victim's Assistance Coordinators. The nearest one to you is Mr. Bill Devlin at the Roanoke office of Commonwealth Catholic Charities. He is a licensed counselor and very well qualified to help. Bill's phone number is [REDACTED]. I know he would welcome a call from you and try to help you in any way that would be appropriate. You are also welcome to request a meeting with Bishop DiLorenzo if you think that would be helpful to you. Just call me and I'll be happy to arrange a meeting.

My hope and sincere prayer is that you will gain back the strength you once had in your faith. Maybe this Lent is a time that you can give to the Lord all your pain and suffering and let him turn it into healing. If you ask him, he will renew your faith. I will keep praying for you each day. Keep in touch.
