First assigned in 1936 to St. Peter and Paul Parish in Souldard. In 1942 named a U.S. Army chaplain with the Archdiocese of the Military Ordinariate.

After World War II returned to the archdiocese to serve as assistant pastor at Most Blessed Sacrament in St. Louis and later in 1946 was assigned to serve at St. Francis de Sales in South St. Louis. The following year he was appointed to St. Joseph Parish in Illmo, Mo.

Assigned his first pastorate in 1948 at St. Joseph Parish in Neier, serving there until 1954, when he was appointed pastor of St. Bridget of Erin Parish in St. Louis.

Became pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Festus in 1961. It was also that year named dean of the Festus Deanery.

The title of monsignor was conferred upon him in 1962. From 1962 to 1966 was assigned to work with the deanery's Propagation of the Faith effort.

Having first served in 1960 with the Council of Catholic Women, was named moderator for the Festus Deanery Council of Catholic Women in August 1962, a post he held until March 1966. That year was named pastor of Our Lady of the Presentation Parish in Overland.

In 1969 was made associate chaplain at the School Sisters of Notre Dame Motherhouse in Lemay, becoming resident chaplain of Sancta Maria Convent in Lemay in 1970.

In 1973 lived at St. Sebastian Parish in Glen Owen and in 1974 at St. Catherine of Siena Parish in Pagedale. Then lived in Wright City, Mo., and later moved to an apartment near St. Anthony of Padua Parish in South St. Louis, followed by residence in the mid-1990s at Regina Cleri, the retirement home for archdiocesan priests. He moved to Mother of Good Counsel Home in 2000. At the time of his death he had been ordained 67 years, longer than any other archdiocesan priest.

Funeral Mass was celebrated at Mother of Good Counsel Home in Normandy. Celebrating the Mass was then-Archbishop Raymond L. Burke. Joining him were Msgr. Marschner's first cousin, retired Auxiliary Bishop Marion F. Forst of the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kan., and some 20 other priests.
