## Monsignor Cletus H. Wagman

Lancaster

Monsignor Cletus H. Wagman of Lancaster, died July 15 at St. Anne's Home for the Aged, Columbia, Lancaster County, after a brief illness. He was 88.

Monsignor Wagman was a Catholic priest in the Diocese of Harrisburg for 59 years. He was senior priest in residence at St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Lancaster.

He attended Mount St. Mary's College, Emmitsburg, Md., and attended St. Vincent's College, Latrobe, Westmoreland County. He graduated from St. Charles Seminary, Overbrooke, in 1942 and was ordained as priest on May 30, 1942 by the late Most Rev. George Leech, Bishop of Harrisburg. He was honored with the title of Monsignor from His Holiness Pope John Paul II on Dec. 18, 1985.

He was 4th degree Knights

of Columbus, local chaplain for the Serra Club and Diocesan Chaplain for Project HEAD (Help Experienced Adults Develop).

Born in Dallastown, he was a son of the late William H. and Sarah McDermott

He leaves no survivors.
