REV. FELIX WERPECHOWSKI

The Rev. Felix Paul Werpechowski, retired pastor of the Holy Name of Jesus Church in Stamford, died Saturday night at his home, 587 N. Main St., Wallingford. He was 70.

He was born in Wallingford, Nov. 25, 1901, son of the late Peter and Victoria (Zambeck) Werpechowski. He attended Lyman Hall High School and studied for the priesthood at St. Thomas' Seminary, Hartford, and at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, Md. His first appointment following his ordination in St. Joseph's Cathedral on May 25, 1929, was assistant at St. Mary's Parish in Middletown. He later served as assistant at Holy Cross Church in New Britain, St. Mary's Church in Union City, and at Holy Name of Jesus Church in Stamford.

Father Werpechowski was a U.S. Army Chaplain from 1941 to 1946, serving in France, Belgium, The Netherlands, Luxembourg, and Germany. He participated in the Normandy invasion, the Liberation of Paris, and the Battle of the Bulge.

At the termination of World War II, he again served as assistant at the Holy Name of Jesus Church, then as assistant

at St. Thomas Church, Thomaston; and pastor of St. Paul's Church in Glenville. He was appointed pastor of Holy Name Church in October, 1959. He remained there until his retirement in May, 1971.

Father Werpechowski is survived by a sister, Mrs. Fred Cook of Wallingford, with whom he made his home, and a brother, Carl Werpechowski, of Wallingford.

A concelebrated pontifical mass will be said Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. in the Holy Name of Jesus Church, Stamford. Visiting hours will be from 5 to 8 p.m. today at the rectory. He will lie in state Tuesday from 5 to 9 p.m. in the Holy Name of Jesus Church.

A mass will be celebrated at 7 p.m. Tuesday. Burial will be in St. John's Cemetery, Wallingford. Contributions may be made to the Holy Name of Jesus Church in memory of Father Werpechowski.
