

# 'American Style' Driving Confuses Learner At Lead

LEAD—'Twas different on the "ould sod" but an elderly Lead man was the victim as the **Rev. John Corry** took driving lessons—"American style"—here Monday.

Taken to the Homestake Hospital suffering from bruises, abrasions and shock was Robert Zipp, elderly Lead resident who was pinned down when **Corry's** car went out of control and jumped the curb on Deadwood's Main street.

Riding with Fr. **Corry** was Frank Carpino of Lead who was teaching the young priest to drive "American style."

**Rev. Corey** explained he was accustomed to driving on the left-hand side of the road in his native Ireland, and as he rounded a corner, swerved to the left. Realizing his error, he tried to jam on his brakes but hit the clutch pedal instead, he told Officer Horace Randel.
