

PRIEST IN FIRST ST. HEDWIG MASS

Unique in the ceremonial history of the archdiocese of Chicago will be the service this morning at St. Hedwig's church, 2226 North Hoyne avenue, when the **Rev. Leonard L. Pruszyński**, who was ordained to the priesthood yesterday by the Most **Rev. John J. Gelnon**, archbishop of St. Louis, will celebrate his first mass, assisted by his two brothers, the **Rev. Joseph J. Pruszyński** and the **Rev. Sigismund J. Pruszyński**, as deacon and subdeacon, respectively.

The **Rev. Leonard Pruszyński**, born July 13, 1910, whose father has been a leader in business circles on the northwest side for the past 35 years, received his early education in St. Hedwig's parochial school, the pastor of which is the **Rev. Francis Uzdrowski**. He completed his high school course at Weber, which in 1929 was known as St. Stanislaus college. Entering immediately into the novitiate of the congregation of the Resurrectionists in Cragin, Ill., he finished his theological studies at St. Louis.

The **Rev. Joseph Pruszyński** studied in Rome and was ordained in 1927 in St. John Lateran cathedral. After working as rector of a Polish training school in Cracow, Poland, he returned to America and is now engaged in missionary work in New York City. The **Rev. Sigismund Pruszyński** was ordained in 1934 and is now assistant to the **Rev. B. Lazaro-wicz** at St. Stanislaus Kostka church, 2318 North Lorel avenue.
