mund J. Pruszynski, as deacon and subdeacon, respectively.

The Rev. Leonard Pruszynski, born July 13, 1910, whose father has been a leader in business circles on the northwest side for the past 35 years, received his early education in St. Hedwig's parochial school, the pastor of which is the Rev. Francis Uzdrowski. He completed his high school course at Weber, which in 1929 was known as St. Stanislaus college. Entering immediately into the novitiate of the congregation of the Resurrectionists in Cragin, Ill., he finished his theological studies at St. Louis.

The Rev. Joseph Pruszynski studied in Rome and was ordained in 1927 in St. John Lateran cathedral. After working as rector of a Polish training school in Cracow, Poland, he returned to America and is now engaged in missionary work in New York City. The Rev. Sigismund Pruszynski was ordained in 1934 and is now assistant to the Rev. B. Lazarowicz at St. Stanislaus Kostka church, 2318 North Lorel avenue.
