

David H. Rocheleau

Father David Rocheleau, a native of St. Charles parish, Cheboygan, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Rocheleau. He received his first Sacraments in the parish church, and attended the parochial grade school. He studied at St. Joseph's Seminary, Grand Rapids, at the time Bishop Noa was rector, attended Cheboygan High, and Cheboygan County Normal School from which he received his teaching certificate. The ordinand continued his education by completing his Bachelor of Science degree from Central Michigan University, Mt. Pleasant, and obtaining the Master of Arts degree in School Administration from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He studied further at Marquette University, Notre Dame University, Biological Station. Father Rocheleau taught school for a total of eight years at Alverno and the Onaway High School.

The newly-ordained entered St. Jerome College, Kitchener, Ontario, Canada in 1956, to begin his training for the Priesthood. He finished with his colleagues at St. John's Seminary, Plymouth, Min-
