

Coleman Priest Named to Post

COLEMAN — The Very **Rev. Leo J. Bujnowski** of Coleman was named Friday as administrator for the San Angelo Diocese of the Catholic church.

He was elected to temporarily replace the Most **Rev. Thomas J. Drury** at a special meeting Friday in San Angelo of the six diocesan consultors. The **Rev. Drury**, formerly bishop of the San Angelo Diocese, was installed Wednesday as bishop of the Corpus Christi Diocese.

tor. He will continue to live in Coleman and remain as pastor of the church for the time being, visiting San Angelo periodically to handle diocesan affairs.

Although a native of Comanche, the **Rev. Bujnowski** lived in Europe 28 years before returning to this country to study for the priesthood. He studied at St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary in Orchard Lake, Mich., for three years and at St. John's Seminary in San Antonio for a similar period.

He was ordained in April 1934, serving in the Archdiocese of San Antonio until the Austin diocese was created in 1948. He remained in the Austin diocese until the San Angelo diocese was created in 1962. He held a pastorate in Brownwood for a number of years before coming to Coleman.

Rev. Bujnowski was named a Knight Commander of the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher in 1964. It is an honorary degree conferred by the Pope on members of the church for their contributions to its work.
