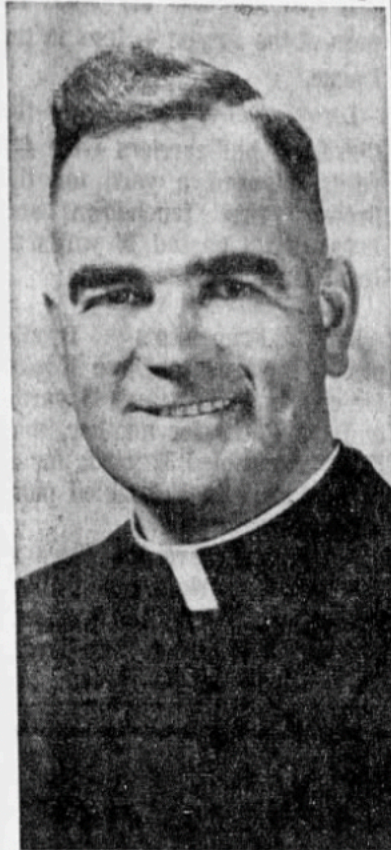


Parish Welcomes Reverend McGreal

Father McGreal was born in Rochester, New York. His family moved to Southern California when he was a child. He attended parochial schools in the Hollywood-Los Angeles area and in 1938, entered Seattle Preparatory School.

He studied for Holy Orders at St. Edward's Seminary and

was ordained in St. James in 1948 by Archbishop Connolly. From June, 1948, to December, 1950, he was assistant at St. Patrick's Church, Tacoma. Then, he filled the assistant's vacancy at St. James Church, Vancouver, where he continued until 1954.

In that year he was transferred to the Holy Rosary Church in Seattle. In September, 1956, he was appointed pastor at St. Mary's church in Monroe, where he remained until his present appointment.

Father McGreal will be installed as pastor next Monday evening starting at seven-thirty o'clock in the Church by Archbishop Connolly. The public is invited.
