

Fr. **Corley** Assigned To Mendocino Pastorate

The **Rev. James Corley** has been named pastor of St. Anthony's Parish, Mendocino, effective in January.

Fr. **Corley**, who has been associate pastor of Holy Spirit Catholic Church for the past three years, will be in charge of two churches — St. Anthony's, Mendocino, and Our Lady of the Valley, in Anderson Valley.

Due to the new assignment, Fr. **Corley** is resigning as president of the Santa Rosa Ministerial Association.

In addition to his duties at the church, Fr. **Corley** has served as chaplain to Catholic students at Santa Rosa Junior College and has been active in the Spanish speaking community of Sonoma County.

He is a member of the Board of Regents of Cardinal Newman High school and the Board of Directors of Santa Rosa Democratic Club.

Fr. **Corley** was ordained a priest in Santa Rosa in 1966. After serving briefly at St. Eugene's Cathedral, he was associate pastor in Eureka for four years before returning to Santa Rosa in 1971.

The Holy Spirit Women's Club will host a reception and farewell party for Fr. **Corley** on Sunday, from 3 until 5 p.m. in the parish hall.
