

Silver Jubilee For Fr. Lambur

The **Rev. Victor M. Lambur**, assistant pastor of St. Martha Church, will observe his 25th anniversary in the priesthood with a silver jubilee Solemn High Mass of Thanksgiving at 12:15 p. m. Sunday at St. Martha.

More than 300 friends, including many from St. Paul and St. Sebastian Churches where he formerly served, are expected to attend a testi-

monial banquet in the parish hall at 1:30 p. m. Sunday.

ACTUALLY, Fr. **Lambur's** ordination anniversary was Feb. 20. He participated earlier in an anniversary program involving members of the 1937 class of St. Mary Seminary in Cleveland.

Fr. **Lambur**, 50, is a native of Cleveland. He attended John Carroll University and Our Lady of the Lake Seminary, which later became St. Mary Seminary.

He was ordained by the late Archbishop Joseph Schrembs in St. John Cathedral.

AFTER serving parishes at Avon and Cleveland, Fr. **Lambur** was assigned from 1947 to 1948 at St. Sebastian Church. After that, he went to St. Stephen in Cleveland and St. William in Euclid.

Fr. **Lambur** was assigned to St. Paul Church here in

1954 and served under the late Rt. **Rev.** Msgr. Clement Boeke until 1959. Fr. **Lambur** gained a reputation as a man in a hurry, but a man with spare time too. He would always stop to talk to anyone seeking his assistance or delay other work to give someone immediate help.

Hence, Fr. **Lambur** became known as a late-arriver at meetings and appointments.

Msgr. Boeke would often announce on Fr. **Lambur's** arrivals, huffing and puffing, "Here comes THE LATE Fr. **Lambur.**"

AT ST. MARTHA, Fr. **Lambur's** duties have been as wide as the parish itself. He teaches at the inquiry classes, directs the confraternity classes for Catholic students attending public high schools and teaches religion at St. Martha High School.

He's spiritual director of the parish unit of the St. Vincent

de Paul Society and the Legion of Mary. He has also taken an interest in the work of Akron's Unidentified Flying Objects (UFO) Committee.

Fr. **Lambur** has a sister who teaches music in Rome, Italy. She is Sister Mary Cecile of the Sisters of Notre Dame.

FR. LAMBUR will be celebrant of the Mass, with the **Rev.** Joseph S. Ungarsky of Holy Trinity in Lorain as archpriest.

The **Rev.** Joseph F. Scharnitsky of St. Agatha Church in Cleveland will be deacon and the **Rev.** Edward J. Gallagher of Our Lady of Victory in Tallmadge will be sub-deacon.

The **Rev.** Joseph P. Horan of St. Paul Church will be master of ceremonies and the Rt. **Rev.** Msgr. Carl E. Frey of St. Martha will give the sermon.

THE REV. William A. Winchester, assistant pastor of Annunciation Church, will be toastmaster at the dinner and introduce the clergy.

The **Rev.** John H. Archibald, pastor of Stow Holy Family Church, will give the invocation and Msgr. Frey will welcome guests. A reception will follow at 7:30 p. m. at St. Martha Hall.
