Moving from his present assignment as pastor at Holy Rosary Parish, Republic, to St. Matthew Parish, Saltsburg, is Rev. Flohr. He is a native of Pittsburgh where he graduated from St. Basil High School. He attended Duquesne University; St. Vincent College, Unity Township, from which he holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy; St. Maur Seminary, South Union, Ky., and Duquesne, where he carned a master's degree in theology. He was ordained a priest May 23, 1964, by the late Bishop William G. Connare at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral, Greensburg.

He received his first assignment as parochial vicar at All Saints Parish, Masontown, in June 1964. He served there until June 1968 when he was named parochial vicar at Immaculate Conception Parish, Irwin. He became instructor of religion and chaplain at Seton Hill College, Greensburg, in 1971 where he remained until June 1975.

Father Flohr received his first pastorate at the former Holy Cross Parish, Iselin, in June 1975. He served subsequent pastorates at the former St. Anthony Parish, Clymer, from August 1975 to January 1981; St. Mary Parish, Yatesboro, from January 1981 to January 1985 when he moved to St. Cecilia Parish, Grindstone, and at Holy Rosary Parish from January 1992 to January 1996.

He served a term as chairman of the Commission for Ecumenism, beginning in July 1973.
