Priest-Educator Was Pastor Of Emsworth Church

Father Smith trict many years as both an educator and pastor.

From 1930 to 1932 he was with the Duquesne University Preparatory School, and then went to Norwalk, Conn., where he was ordained June 5, 1933.

He was instructor in classical languages and assistant director of Holy Ghost College, Cornwells Heights, Pa., from 1933 to 1937 and instructor in canon law and Sacred Scripture and assistant director of St. Mary's Seminary, Norwalk, from 1937 to 1939.

He was the founder and first dean of St. Basil's, Stamford, Conn., for Catholics of the Ruthenia Rite. During the next 10 years he p

During the next 10 years he r served at Duquesne University as professor of philosophy and psychology, head of the department of philosophy, dean of the College of Arts and y Sciences, dean of the School of Music, and secretary of the executive committee and board of directors.

In 1950, he became pastor of Sacred Heart Church, a post he held until his death.
