2 Raised To Reverend Monsignor

CAMDEN — Bishop George H. Guilfoyle has announced the Papal appointments of a pastor and an administrator from the Camden diocese as honorary prelates with the title of Reverend Monsignor. The Rev. William Patrick pastor of St. McCorristin,

McCorrisun, pastor of St. Frances Cabrini parish in Ocean City, and the Rev. Glendon Robertson san secretary for have both been appointed a "Prelate of Honor of His Holiness."

Msgr. McCorristin has served as pastor of St. Frances Cabrini parish since October 1968. He was previously pastor of Immaculate Heart of Mary, Woodlynne; St. Paul, Stone Harbor; St. Joan of Arc, Camden; and St. Mat-thew, National Park. He had also served as assistant pastor at Immaculate Conception, Camden, and at Holy Spirit, Atlantic City.

Born in Millville, Msgr. IcCorriston attended St. McCorriston Charles Seminary, Catonsville, Md., and St. Bonaventure College, Allegany, N.Y. He com-

(Continued from Page 5) pleted his seminary studies at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary, Emmitsburg, Md. He was ordained in May 1937 at St. Mary's Cathedral in Trenton.

In addition to his pastoral duties, he has served as chairman of the Diocesan Commission for Property and Building and as chaplain of the Catholic Daughters of America in the Camden diocese.

Msgr. Robertson has been secretary for education since June 1973 and previously served as principal of Holy Spirit High School, Absecon, for eight years and as principal of St. James High School, Carney's Point, for two years. He was on the faculty of Gloucester Catholic High School for two years and had served as assistant pastor at Holy Spirit, Atlantic City.

Born in St. Louis, Mo., M s g r . Robertson attended Georgetown University and earned a bachelor of science degree at LaSalle College. He completed his seminary studies at American College, Louvain, Belgium, earning a bachelor's degree in philosophy and a master's degree in theology. He was ordinaed in Louvain in June, 1957. He later earned a master's degree and a PhD. in educational philosophy, guidance and administration at Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C.

Msgr. Robertson has served on the Diocesan Liturgical Commission and on the Priests" Senate of the Diocese of Camden. He is currently a member of the Diocesan Pastoral Council and the Inter-Parochial Cooperation Plan Board.
