Dear Aras-I had to smile when read your letter, for that very morning I had made a mental note to start my tuberous begonias-later than I usually do, incidentally. I have two, a single frilled salmon pink and a deep scarlet double. I find that the single frilled is more sturdy and will flower more profusely than the double. In late February, or early March, I bring the oulbs up from the cellar, shake the lirt from them and examine for any njury or bite. They are then plant-ed in three-inch nots, not more than in inch or so below the surface, in
