Rev. H. M. Gallagher Goes to Kansas City

Rev. Henry M. Gallagher, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas F. Gallagher, 7 Prescott st., Charlestown, who was ordained to the priesthood May 1 at the Cathedral of Holy Cross by Bishop Richard J. Cushing, was tendered a farewell reception by members of his family and friends this morning at the South Station before leaving for Kansas City, Mo., where he is to report May 21 for duty in that diocese.

Rev. Fr. Gallagher celebrated his first solemn high mass in St. Mary's Church, Charlestown, on Mothers' Day. He was tendered a reception at K. of C. clubhouse, followed by a dinner.

Fr. Gallagher was born in Charlestown, graduated from the Harvard Grammar School and attended Charlestown High School. He graduated from Boston College High School, after which he attended the West Stockbridge Jesuit School and St. Stanislaus School in Guelph, Ont. He studied for the secular priesthood at St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, Can., and entered

St. Francis Seminary at Loretto, Penn., where he completed his course in theology.

En route to Kansas he will visit relatives at New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Fr. Gallagher's father was for 35 years a carrier in the Boston postal district, mostly at the Charlestown postal station. He retired from service three years ago.

While attending St. Francis Seminary, Fr. Gallagher was president of the Garvey Literary Society, Prefect of the Third Order of St. Francis, manager of the mission store.

Dear Aras—I had to smile when I read your letter, for that very morning I had made a mental note to start my tuberous begonias—later than I usually do, incidentally. I have two, a single frilled salmon pink and a deep scarlet double. I find that the single frilled is more sturdy and will flower more profusely than the double. In late February, or early March, I bring the bulbs up from the cellar, shake the dirt from them and examine for any injury or bite. They are then planted in three-inch pots, not more than an inch or so below the surface, in
