

REV. A. J. STEINES, OSC

Rev. Aloysius J. Steines, OSC, 38, formerly of Butler and Onamia, drowned in Pulaski lake near Buffalo when his boat capsized.

Rev. Steines was on vacation, with relatives who had a cottage on the lake, when the drowning occurred.

The funeral will be Thursday at 10 a.m. in the Holy Cross church at Onamia with Most

Rev. Peter Bartholome, co-adjutor bishop of St. Cloud, officiating. Interment will be in the Monastic cemetery on the shores of Onamia lake.

Rev. Steines was born at St. Killian, Minnesota, on June 19, 1912, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Mathias A. Steines, now of Stratford, Wisconsin. He was ordained 12 years ago at the Crosier monastery in Hastings, Nebraska.

Since then, Father Steines has been pastor at Wahkon, McGrath, Bertha and Butler. He also taught at the Crosier seminary, Onamia, and for one year at another Crosier school in Fort Wayne, Indiana. In connection with his parish work, he had been active in Boy Scout work in several communities along the southeast shore of Mille Lacs lake.

Survivors include his parents and a brother, Brother Clement Steines, OSC, at the Onamia monastery.

The body is at the Brenny Funeral home in Little Falls today. Wednesday and Thursday it will be at the Crosier monastery in Onamia until the time of the funeral.
