

FATHER O'DONOHOE TO LEAVE.

Popular Rector of Holy Name Church
to Concordia.

Rev. Thomas O'Donohoe, for the past three years pastor of the Church of the Holy Name, has been recalled by Bishop John Cunningham, of Concordia, and will leave for that diocese next Tuesday.

By the leaving of Father O'Donohoe, Winfield loses one of the most popular Catholic priests which the town has contained since it has had a parish. A young man, just out of college, Father O'Donohoe came here as assistant to Father James Burke. Cheerful and witty, the newly landed Irishman made hosts of friends among Catholics and Protestants. At the death of Father Burke, the parish asked that Father O'Donohoe be appointed pastor. Right Rev. J. J. Hennessey of Wichita, therefore appointed Father O'Donohoe rector.

Father O'Donohoe pursued his earlier studies at St. Patrick's college, County Cavan, Ireland. He was born in the town of Cavan. His theological studies were finished at St. Patrick's college, Carlow. He was one of the youngest men ordained to the priesthood. While in college he was appointed to the diocese of Concordia, as is the custom. Coming to this country, the diocese of Wichita needed priests, so Father O'Donohoe was sent here, in November, 1910. December 17, 1910, Father Burke died, and Father O'Donohoe was named pastor.
