Second-largest class of priests ordained in Metuchen

METUCHEN - A Fulbright scholar who taught in ty, and French at the University of New Mexico. France, a former physics professor from the Technical University of Wroclaw, Poland, a 67-year-old budget analyst are just three of the 15 men being ordained priests in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen by Bishop Theodore E. McCarrick today at 10 a.m. in St. Francis Cathedral, here. These men make up the second-largest class to be ordained this year in the United States.

This year's class includes Richard B. Abramowicz of Perth Amboy, Glenn J. Comandini of Raritan, Michael E. Crummy of Savreville, Joseph M. Curry of Edison, James W. Hagerman of Perth Amboy, Edward J. Jankowski of Somerville, Jerome A. Johnson of Freehold, Michael G. Krull of New Brunswick, Jozef M. Melaniuk of South River, Kenneth R. Murphy of Piscataway, David J. Pekola of Carteret, George M. Pisanello of Montclair, Joseph V. Romanoski of Manville, Peter G. Suhaka also of Manville, and Marvin A. Carney, Jr., of Louisville, Ky.

Born in Jersey City, Abramowicz spent 14 years as a budget analyst in Fort Monmouth, and 17 years as a medical administrative officer in the U.S. Air Force, before entering Ss. Cyril and Methodius Seminary in Orchard Lake, Mich. A graduate of Seton Hall University in South Orange, he has a bachelor of arts degree in liberal arts and a second degree in accounting.

Abramowicz served as a transitional deacon in Immaculate Conception Parish, Clinton. He also worked in several parishes throughout the diocese while preparing for the priesthood. He will celebrate his first Mass in Sacred Heart Church in Irvington, tomorrow.

Carney, originally from Tonopah, Nevada, has a master's degree in divinity and in elementary education.
