

# Young North Side Priest Sings First Mass Tomorrow

## St. Cyprian Service Family Affair

It will be a family affair when Rev. John S. Schutzman sings his first mass tomorrow morning in St. Cyprian's Catholic Church, North Side.

Six of his 12 brothers and sisters will play parts in the mass. John's parents and other brothers and sisters will participate from the pews.

The young priest, who was ordained only this morning in Covington, Ky., is a graduate of the University of Dayton and Catholic University of America.

Three of Father's Schutzman's brothers, Walter, Joseph and Robert, will sing in the choir. Another brother, James 10, will serve as an altar boy.

His 16-year-old sister, Helen, will march in a sodality procession, and Patricia, 13, another sister, will bear the pillow.

Rev. Schutzman will realize his life's ambition when he celebrates the mass. Since he was seven years old, he wanted to be a priest. His father, vividly recalls "the home-made altars John would erect in the house."

"He used to get all kinds of Holy pictures, candles, colored paper, statues and medals, and place them in various forms on mantels, tables and chairs," the elder Schutzman said.

"Every week he would change something to make it appear different. Every month he would have an entire new altar."

Rev. Schutzman attended St. Cyprian's Parish School and
