
Rev. Gerald Hindman Sings First Solemn High Mass Sunday

Rev. Gerald Hindman, O. S. B., of Jackson, will sing his first solemn High Mass in his native parish church on Sunday June 10, at 11 o'clock, at St. Peter's Catholic Church.

Rev. Hindman, is the son of the late Edward E. Hindman and Mary Ellen Donovan. His father being a prominent leader in civic and state affairs, a member of the Hinds County Bar and U. S. District Attorney for the Southern District of the State. Formerly of Raymond, his mother was a prominent business woman, and both were devout Catholics and took active parts in all affairs of the church.

Known as a small boy as Edward Hindman, Jr., his education was begun in kindergarten at St. Joseph's Academy through junior high school. He entered St. Joseph Preparatory Seminary in 1937, became a Parish Priest in the Diocese of Natchez. Later determined to enter the fourteen centuries old Order of Saint Benedict, he was clothed with the habit of a Benedictine Monk August 10, 1939 by Rt. Rev. Columban Tuis, OSB, Abbot of St. Joseph's Abbey.
