



PRIEST LEAVES — According to word received from the chancery office of the Diocese of Alexandria, the Rev. F. Patrick Donohoe has been appointed pastor of a new parish in Shreveport. Father Donohoe will leave Sacred Heart in Pineville, early next week to begin work in the Caddo Heights section of Shreveport where the new church, dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, will be located.

From 1938-39 Father Donohoe served as chaplain at St. Joseph's Home then in Pineville, also attending the Catholic missions at Deville and Rochelle. Following his transfer to Monroe, where he served for three years, the priest entered the U. S. Navy as chaplain, early in the war, and served for more than four years in the Pacific area, with Seabees on construction and later aboard a carrier.

Upon the termination of his naval service, with the rank of lieutenant-commander, Fr. Donohoe was assigned to the chaplaincy at the Veterans Hospital in Gulfport, Miss., serving there for three years. Following a year of study at the Catholic University in Washington, D. C., the priest was assigned to Sacred Heart Church in Pineville, where he attended the various institutions and started the mission church at Tioga which will be dedicated on Dec. 7.

Ground for the new church in Shreveport was purchased by Bishop Charles P. Greco to serve Caddo Heights, Morningside, Sunset, Warner Park and other nearby residential sections of the city.
