

Rev. George Roulier Of Haiti Mission Visits Home Here

Rev. George D. Roulier, O.M.I., has arrived in this country from Camp Perrin, Haiti, where he is a mission priest and instructor, to spend a two-month vacation, part of which will be with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Philippe Roulier of 6 Walnut street.

During the greater part of his vacation, Fr. Roulier will talk on mission work at various churches, particularly in the Lowell diocese.

Fr. Roulier, an Oblate mission priest, has been in Haiti since September, 1946, and is an instructor at Oblate Junior seminary at Camp Perrin, where many native youths are studying for the priesthood.

As part of the studies in English, Fr. Roulier uses the Transcript, which he has had mailed to him regular since he has been in Haiti. Apart from the news columns of which the Adams section comes in for the lion's share of attention, Fr. Roulier said today that the boys daily follow the comics which they find particularly interesting. In fact they are such ardent Transcript fans that their parting request to Fr. Roulier as he left for this country was that he would keep the paper coming to them during his absence. This detail Fr. Roulier attended to promptly upon arrival here.

At the Oblate seminary Fr. Roulier is an instructor in Latin, history and religion as well as English. Since his assignment to Haiti his work there has included 10 months as pastor at Chardonnières, where he was in charge of the erection of a new school and has started work on a new convent prior to
