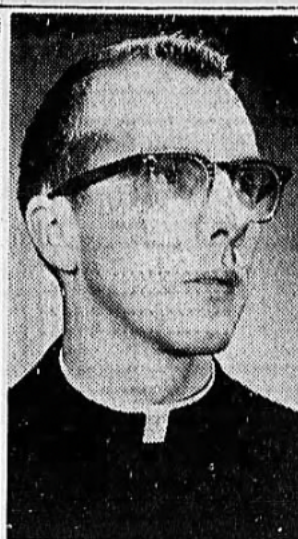

Saturday At Cathedral

Two Priests To Be Ordained

On Saturday, June 12, in The Cathedral of The Immaculate Conception, Saint John, His Excellency, Most **Rev. A. B. Leverman**, Bishop of Saint John, will ordain two young men to the priesthood at a Mass of Concelebration, at 11 a.m.

They are **Rev. Paul G. Murphy**, CSsR, Saint John and **Rev. Daniel Peck**, of Sydney, N.S.

Rev. Paul G. Murphy is a son of Mrs. Edward Murphy, 12 Elizabeth Court, and the late Mr. Murphy. He received his early education in Holy Trinity and St. Malachy's schools and then went to St. Mary's College, at Brockville, Ont., of the Redemptorist Order and to Holy Redeemer Seminary, of the Order at Woodstock, Ont. In 1962 he received his BA at Assumption University, Windsor.

Father Murphy also received

his bachelor of sacred theology degree from Assumption University in 1965.

He will celebrate his first solemn mass in St. Pius X Church, Saint John, at 11:30 a.m., June 13. His uncle, **Rev. Gregory Murphy**, CSsR, now stationed at St. Alphonsus Church in Windsor, will give the sermon. A reception will be held in the church hall from 3 to 5:30 p.m.

Rev. Daniel Peck is a son of Mrs. Lillian (Cooper) **Peck** of Sydney, N.S., and the late William Patrick **Peck**. He studied at Sacred Heart School, St. Joseph's School and Sydney Academy, Sydney. He pursued further studies at Xavier College, Sydney, St. Patrick's College, Ottawa and then at St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish from which he received his B.A. Degree in 1960. His theological studies were made at Holy Heart Seminary, Halifax.

Other members of the family are Sister St. Patrick of Faith CND, St. Joseph's Convent, Mabou, N.S. and Mrs. Donald (Lollie) Morrison, Sydney, N.S.

Father **Peck** will celebrate his first solemn mass at St. Anthony **Daniel** Church in Sydney on Sunday, June 13, at 11:15 a.m. Solemn benediction will take place at 7 p.m. in the same church, followed by a reception in the parish hall from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.
