

Father Falvey Takes Faculty Job in Orient

Reverand Mark Falvey, S. J. son of Mis. J. B. Falvey of 818 B street, leaves Monday for Shanghai, China, where he will teach at Gonzaga, an American college.

As a farewell to his parishoners of St. Clare's parish at Santa Clara, a solemn high mass will be celebrated tomorrow by Father Falvey assisted by two of his brothers, Rev. Arthur Falvey, S. J. deacon, and Rev. Robert Falvey, sub-deacon.

Rev. James J. Lyons, S. J., president of the University of Santa Clara, will be master of ceremontes Rev Zacheas Maher. S. J., provincial of the California province of the Jesunt order, will deliver the sermon.

Besides teaching at the college Father Falvey will engage in parish work at Shanghai. He was a student as a small hoy in San Matteo at the Central grammar school and went from there to Santa Clara.
