

Ordination at St. Joseph's

The Reverend Bill Groves

The Rev. Bill Groves will be ordained at St. Joseph's Catholic Church Friday,
August 1 at 7 p.m. The Most Reverend
Charles A. Buswell, Pueblo Diocese
Bishop, will preside at the Ordination
Mass. The Rev. Daniel Huber and The
Rev. Thomas Noesen will be concelebrants along with many other priests of the Pueblo Diocese. About six priests from the Milwaukee Archdioces and the Grand Island Dioceses will also be

attending.

The ordination is open to the community. A reception and dance will follow at

the Parish Hall.

This is an unusual ordination as ordinations in most dioceses are held in the diocesan cathedral. However during the fall of 1977 as part of his diocese training, Groves worked at St. Joseph's while attending St. Francis Seminary in Mil-waukee, Wis. Then he transferred into the Pueblo Diocese because he liked the area so well and also wanted to use his Spanish speaking capabilities learned while living in Mexico. Also unusual is the fact Groves is a convert into catholicism.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. B. J. Groves of Oklahoma City, Groves was born and raised in Oklahoma City. He graduated from U. S. Grant High School in 1970 and attended Oklahoma University for two years. He then lived and worked with a religious youth group, "Los Hijos De Dios" in Mexico for two years. He went to St. Meinred Seminary in Indiana in 1974 and received his B.A. in 1976. In 1980 he received his M.A. in physchology from St. Francis Seminary in Milwaukee.
Saturday, August 2 Rev. Groves will be celebrating his first Mass at 2 p.m. at the

Moon Farm Day Camp in Fruita. A pot-luck dinner will follow.

A spiritual reformation retreat for all seminarians of the Pueblo Diocese starts Monday, July 28 at St. Joseph's. Leading the retreat will be The Rev. Bonfadini, vocation director of the Pueblo Diocese. Also, Bishop Arthur Tafoya and Bishop Buswell will be presenting sessions.

Rev. Groves has been assigned to St. Mary's Parish at Walsenbury, Colo. where he will be assuming the associate pastorship following a brief tour of Colo-

rado with his parents.
