

## Fr. MacGuinness Funeral Rites Monday at St. Ann's

Funeral services for the Rev. James L. MacGuinness, pastor of St. Ann's Church in South Peabody since January, 1953, who died yesterday, will be held Monday at the church.

The Rev. Paul McLaughlin will officiate at a children's Mass at 8 AM. A Solemn Requiem Mass will be sung at 10 AM. The office of the dead will be recited Sunday at 4 PM.

The Right Rev. Monsignor Augustine S. Hargedon, pastor of Our Lady, Star of the Sea Church, Marblehead, will preach the eulogy. Officiating at the Mass will be the Rev. Timothy F. Cavan, pastor of St. John's, Peabody, celebrant; the Rev. Patrick Curtin, assistant at St. John's, Peabody, deacon, and the Rev. John Leonard of the Church of St. John, the Evangelist, North Chelmsford, sub-deacon.

Burial will be in Oak Grove Cemetery, Medford.

### ORDAINED IN HUB

Father MacGuinness, an uncle of James L. MacGuinness, business manager of the Lynn School Department and secretary of the Lynn School Committee, was born in Boston 73 years ago and was ordained in the priesthood by William Cardinal O'Connell in 1910.

He has served at St. Peter's Church, Lowell; St. Margaret's in Brockton, Our Lady of Lourdes in Beachmont, Star of the Sea in Marblehead, St. Patrick's in Lawrence, St. John's in Roxbury, Our Lady of Sorrows in Sharon, chaplain of the Sacred Heart School in Sharon, chaplain of the House of the Angel Guardian in Boston, and chaplain of Mount St. Joseph's Academy in Brighton before coming to South Peabody.

Since coming to Peabody, construction of a new church got underway, largely due to his spiritual leadership.

He also leaves four nieces, Mrs. Sumner Meredith of Hyde Park; Mrs. Edward Harney of Cambridge, Mrs. Joseph Baldrate of Everett and Miss Bernice MacGuinness of Medford.

Visiting hours at the rectory at 136 Lynn Street, South Peabody, will be from 7 PM to 10 PM tonight and Saturday all day until until 10 P.M.

Members of St. Ann's Ladies' Sodality will meet at 8.30 o'clock Saturday at the church and go to the rectory across the street where they will pay their respects to their late pastor.
