

## Fargo Priest To Give Solon Prayer

Spiritual director of the Cardinal Muench Seminary at 1310 Broadway since its inception in 1962, Rev. William K. Amriott will give the opening prayer before the U.S. Senate on Oct. 13.

The invitation was received by Father Amriott Monday from Rev. Frederick Brown Harris, Senate chaplain, through the office of U.S. Sen. Milton R. Young, R-N.D.

Father Amriott will be the second Fargo clergyman to open a session in Congress this year. Rev. Harry E. Olson Jr., pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church, was the guest chaplain at the April 29 opening of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Father Amriott will stop in Washington to give the invocation before the Senate before going on to Southbridge, Mass., where he will attend the wedding of his brother, Richard, on Oct. 16.

A native of Fitchburg, Mass., Father Amriott, 30, was ordained in 1960 at Dubuque, Iowa, coming then to the Fargo Diocese. He was a chaplain at the Grafton, N.D. hospital, coming to Fargo as assistant pastor of St. Anthony of Padua church from 1960 to 1962, when he was transferred to the seminary.

Since coming to Fargo, Father Amriott has received a master of science degree in counseling at NDSU and is working on a master of arts in history. He holds a bachelor of arts degree in philosophy and psychology from St. John's Seminary of Brighton, Mass.
