600 Expected for School Boards Meet

Some 600 persons are expected to attend the North Dakota School Boards Association annual convention Monday and Tuesday at the Bismarck Civic Center.

"Democracy, Demands, Decisions" will be the theme of the convention which will feature speakers, election of officers, clinics, panel discussions and films.

Keynote speakers will be Mrs. Frederick A. Reimers, second vice president of the National School Boards Association, and Dr. William Amioti, a member of the North Dakota State University Department of Education. Mrs. Reimers will address the evening banquet Monday and Dr. Amioti will address the traditional convention breakfast Tuesday.

Convention delegates will elect a president, vice president, Northeast District director and Southwest District director Monday at 3 p.m. following a report from a nominations committee.

"Meet the Expert Clinics" will be held at 1:15 p.m. Monday and 10:45 a.m. Tuesday. They will feature Dr. Gerald Hamerlik, Grand Forks School Board, and Lt. Col. Edgar Johnson, Bismarck School Board, on professional negotiations; Carol Burchinal, state director of the Board for Vocational Education, and Larry Selland, assistant director of the Board for Vocational Education, on vocational education; Frank U. Smith, executive secretary of the North Dakota High School Activities Association, and August Spiss, Mandan Public School superintendent and president of the NDHSAA, on the high school activities association, and Howard Snortland, as-

sistant superintendent of the Department of Public Instruction, and Gerald W. Vandewalle, assistant state attorney general, on school finances and school law.

Three panel discussions will also be held during the convention. On Monday at 10:30 a.m., constitutional revision will be discussed by George Dynes, a Dickinson School Board member, and convention delegates Wayne Sanstead, a Minot state legislator and teacher, and Kenneth Knudson, a Taylor state legislator and chairman of the House Education Committee.

Mrs. Ray Miller, director and Fargo Board member, will preside at a panel discussion on curriculum at 9 a.m. Tuesday. M. F. Peterson, superintendent of the Department of Public Instruction will moderate the panel which will feature Leon Olson, superintendent of Williston Public Schools, Dr. Roger Worner, Fargo Public Schools, and Richard K. Klein, assistant

will feature teenage and adult ex-addicts.

Beginning at 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday and 3 p.m. Tuesday three films, "The Trip Back," "Vocational Education," and "The Alcoholic American" will be shown to convention delegates.

Mrs. Reimers, Monday's banquet speaker, is a former teacher, research counselor, interviewer and school board arbitrator. She is a graduate of Vassar College and LaSalle Extension University.

Mrs. Reimers is a consultant to the U.S. Office of Education and is a member of the Technical Advisory Committee of the White House Conference on Children and Youth, the National Committee for the Support of the Public Schools and the Council for Basic Education.

Dr. Amioti, Tuesday's breakfast speaker, has conducted seminars and workshops for law enforcement officers, businessmen, PTA leaders, clergymen,

welfare workers, labor leaders, teachers, students, hospital employees and counselors. A graduate of Boston College, Dr. Amioti has done graduate work at Aquinas Institute in Dubuque, Iowa and North Dakota State University, and received a doctorate of philosophy at the University of North Dakota.

He is a member of Phi Delta Kappa, the American Personnel and Guidance Association, Sigma Nu Fraternity, the American College Personnel Association, the Association for Counselor Education and Supervision, the American Association of University Professors, the North Dakota Personnel and Guidance Association, the National Congress of Parents and Teachers and the International Communications Association and a faculty advisor for the Farmer's Union Cooperative Association Fraternity, for Sigma Nu Fraternity and for the North Dakota State University Interfraternity Council.
