"He had a great love of learning," said Rev. Anthony Rigoli, pastor of Holy Angels Church and a longtime friend. He had degrees from Catholic University in Washington, D.C., and Canisius College and belonged to the Mensa Society.

"He taught math and Russian," Rev. Rigoli said. "His hobby was ham radio operation, and when he taught at Holy Angels, he led a ham radio club."

Rev. McGurrin was born in Buffalo and attended Holy Angels School and Holy Angels Collegiate Institute before his 1944 ordination in Washington. Much of his teaching career was at Holy Angels Collegiate Institute and Bishop Fallon in Buffalo and Bishop Newman High School in West Palm Beach, Fla.

He also had served as a missionary and as principal and pastor of Mary Immaculate School in Brazil and had been pastor of other churches in Massachusetts and Florida.

Survivors include a sister, Kathryn Hamilton, and two brothers, William of Getzville and James of Eggertsville.
