Rev. Gatineau Our Lady's Curate Dies

The Rev. Oscar A. Gatineau, 45, curate at Our Lady Immaculate Church since Aug. 29, died suddenly Sunday night while visiting at the home of his parents, Oscar F. and Agnes M. (Berthiaume) Gatineau of 15 Oakes avenue, Southbridge. He was pronounced dead at Harrington Memorial Hospital. Dr. John T. Nasse, associate medical examiner, said death was due to natural causes.

Father Gatineau was born in Southbridge and attended local schools, graduating from Mary E. Wells High School in 1933.

He was graduated from Sacred Heart College, St. Victor Canada, in 1947 and from the College of Philosophy and Theology, Montreal, in 1951.

He was ordained to the priesthood in Notre Dame Church May 26, 1951 by Most Rev. John J. Wright, then bishop of Worcester, now of Pittsburgh. He was the first native of Southbridge to be ordained in his home town.

Father Gatineau's first assignment was to Immaculate Conception parish, Fitchburg. He later served at Sacred Heart, Webster, St. Anne's and St. Patrick's, Sturbridge, St. Jo-
