Father Gall was born in Sleepy
Eye on Nov. 25, 1911, one of the
15 children of the deceased Mr.
and Mrs. Andrew Gall. The family moved to Buckman where
Father Gall attended grade
school. He took his preparatory

He was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Joseph F. Busch in St. John's Abbey church on June 6, 1938, and celebrated his first solemn mass in St. Michael's parish, Buckman, on June 12. He served as temporary assistant pastor of Pierz parish before being assigned assistant pastor of St. Mary's Cathedral parish in the same year.

In 1942 he was named pastor of St. John's parish, Swanville, and there undertook an extensive renovation project and cleared the parish debt. Throughout his

parish assignments, he would be the pastor who would repair and renovate the facilities of the par-ish to which he would be as-

After 12 years at Swanville he was appointed pastor of Annun-ciation parish, Mayhew Lake, for a short time, and in the same a snort time, and in the same year, 1934, was named pastor of St. Nicholas parish, Belle River. In 1958 he was transferred to St. Nicholas parish, St. Nicholas, and the following year named pastor of the Elk River parish.
