The school was forced first to discontinue Grade One. This past year, Grades Two and Three were dropped, leaving five grades for the three nuns to teach.

St. Ann's School in Three Rivers was forced to close two years ago. It had been in existence for 84 years.

Next September, the 19 seniors graduating from Sts. Peter and Paul will be in Palmer High School's freshman class. Sixteen other pupils will enter eighth grade, as we enter seventh grade, as we enter seventh grade, as the public school system.
