Henry Gailiunas. Father Steponattis was born Sept 1, 1912, in the village of Skaisgirial, Sin-tautai parish. Lathuanian, the son of Kazimieras and Petronele (Stalioraitis) Steponaitis. He was one of 10 children. He attended grammar school in Katilai and Sakai and Naumiestis secondary school. He nemaret for the neinschood at

Aummestis secondary school. He prepared for the priesthood at the diocesan seminar in Vilkaviskis and was ordained on June 13, 1937, by Bishop Antanas Karosas at the Vilkaviskis Cathedral.

Vilkaviskis Cathedral. His first assignment in the priesthood was to the parish of St. Joseph in Plutiskes. Eighteen mon-this later he was assigned to the Cathedral parish of 10,000 people. In October 1944, Father Steponaitis was evacuated to Germany by the retresting German Army and then

retreating German Army and then was assigned to do pastoral in Nor-thern Germany where he took care of



the Lithuanians in six displaced persons camps. In 1948 he was sent to England by Bishop Vincent Podolski to care for the spiritual needs of the Lithuanians in Liverpool, Man-chester, Widnes, St. Helens and several scattered small villages in Northern England.

Northern England. On July 23, 1953, he was sent to Dallas, Texas, to do parish work. Then, on Jan 28, 1954, he was assign-ed as curate to Our Lady of Vilna parish, Worcester.

In June 1968, Father Steponaltis was assistant pastor of St. Casimir's parish, Worcester. On Sept. 10, 1971 he was appointed administrator of St. Francis of Assis Parish, Following his incardination as a priest of the Worcester Diocese he was named pastor and has been the parish's spiritual leader for the past 16 years. Throughout his priesthood, Father Steponaltis has been devoted to his priestly ideals and to the youth and iderly. He is an avid horticulturist and the parish grounds are proof of his talents. his talents. Throughout his tenure, St. Francis
