Busch on June 6, 1938, at St. John's Abbey Church, Collegeville. He celebrated his first Mass on June 12, 1938, at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Buckman.

Father Gall served in the following assignments: assistant pastor, Church of St. Joseph, Pierz, September 1938-December 1938; Cathedral of St. Mary December 1938-July 1942; Chaplain at St. Raphael's Convent, August 1941-July 1942; pastor, Church of St. John, Swanville and Church of St. Bernard, Ward Springs, July 1942-September 1954;

Father Gall was also a member of the Committee for On-Going Education of Priests, the Priests' Senate and the Diocesan Finance Council, Father was a very active member of Together Encountering Christ.
