## 'New Holiness' Cited by Pope

Pope John XXIII said that Mother Seton's beatification adds a new quality to the "varied concept of the Church's holiness."

After referring to her fervor as an Episcopalian, Pope John said that Mother Seton arrived at the Catholic faith "not by a denial of the past but rather as reaching a providential goal . for which she had been prepared by the whole course of her former life."

THE POPE also praised the United States and called Mother Seton a "precursor" of the U.S. parachial school system in his address in St. Peter's Basilica at an afternoon ceremony for the beattleaction, the last in a series of steps which lead to being named a Saint.
