Rev. Scobee Conducts First Mass Here

The Rev. Robert Glenn Scobee. son of Mr. and Mrs. Tim Kelly, of near Palmyra, who was ordained to the priesthood for the diocese of St. Joseph at Conception, Mo., on May 22, conducted his first Solemn Mass at St. Joseph Church in Palmyra at 9:30 o'clock Sunday morning. Approximately three hundred people attended the service, following which Rev. Scobee, members of the visiting clergy and members of Rev. Scobee's family were welcomed with a banquet at the Midway Inn, west of Palmyra on Highway 56. The afternoon of the day was spent socially.
