Rev. William A. Braun

The Rev. William Aloysius Braun, S.S., 46, former teacher at St. Charles College, Catonsville, died today at St. Joseph's Hospital, following an illness of several weeks.

Born in Baltimore the son of Joseph and Frances Braun, he attended Loyola High School and Loyola College.

Father Braun received his theological training at the American College in Rome, from 1938 until 1940, and during the following two years at St. Mary's Seminary, Baltimore.

He was ordained May 30, 1942, by Archbishop Michael J. Curley, and for the next eight years was engaged in parish work at St. Dominic's Church here.

Sulpician Work

In 1950 Father Braun entered Sulpician work at St. Charles College, teaching Latin and Greek there for nine years until he was transferred to St. Joseph College, Mountain View, Cal.

Father Braun completed his career at St. Thomas Seminary, Louisville, after spending four years at the West Coast college.

Surviving are a brother, Joseph, of Baltimore; and two sisters, Miss Margare, of Baltimore, and Mrs. Mary Dowling, of Jacksonville, Florida.

A solemn requiem mass will be offered at 10.30 A.M. Monday at the St. Charles College Chapel. Father Braun's body may be viewed at the chapel from 3 P.M. tomorrow until the Monday mass. Burial will be in the St. Charles College Cemetery.
