## Donald Bruneau To Be Ordained A Priest June 5

Donald Albert Bruneau, elder son of Mr. and Mrs. Napoleon Bruneau, 108½ Weaver St., Winooski, will be ordained to the priesthood in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception by Bishop Edward F. Ryan Saturday, June 5, at 9 a.m.

He was graduated from St. Francis Xavier's School in 1942 and from Cathedral High School in 1946. He studied for two years at St. Michael's College and two years at the Seminary of Philosophy in Montreal before entering the Grand Seminary of Theology also in Montreal. He received a bachelor of arts in Theology, cum laude, from the University of Montreal in 1953.

Father Bruneau became a sub-deacon May 30, 1953, at the hands of Cardinal Paul Emile Leger. He was elevated to deacon Sept. 13, 1953, by Bishop Conrad Chaumont.

The young priest will celebrate his first solemn high mass Sunday, June 6, at 10 a.m. in St. Francis Xavier's Church.

Arch-priest at the mass will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Georges L'Ecuuyer; deacon will be Rev. Georges Dupuis and sub-deacon, Rev. Jean Paul Laplante of St. Albans. The Rev. John Ledoux of St. Johnsbury will deliver the sermon.

Altar boys will be Roger Bruneau, his brother, Bernard Bruneau, Paul Villemaire and Robert Villemaire, all cousins. Ushers will also be cousins, Raymond and Gerard Villemaire.

The choir will sing the "O, Mariale," by William Marsh. A mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin, under the direction of Albert J. Villemaire, choirmaster, who is Fr. Bruneau's maternal grandfather.

Following mass, a banquet will be served for the relatives and intimate friends in St. Francis Xavier's School hall. A reception will be held, also in the school hall, from 3 to 5:30 p.m. Sunday. Sunday evening at 6:30 Fr. Bru-
